Policy Statement:

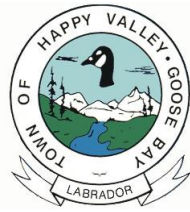
Many Community members are interested in choosing healthier foods and beverages, being physically active, staying tobacco-free, caring for the environment and supporting local products.
